Message from the Pastor

Dear Bethel Family,

I recently read this beautiful hymn in one of the books assigned for my doctoral degree, and I couldn't resist sharing it with you all, hoping that God would speak to you through this. The hymn's title is "Lord, You Give the Great Commission," and it was written by Jeffery Rowthorn in 1978. The hymn invites the Christians to a deeper understanding of the great commission. One of the reasons I like this hymn is its challenge to reprioritize the "do list" in the disciplemaking business. The hymn opens with this verse:

"Lord, you give the great commission: 'Heal the sick and preach the word.' Lest the church neglects its mission, and the gospel goes unheard, help us witness to your purpose with renewed integrity."

It's profound that the poet, guided by the Holy Spirit, places' healing' before 'preaching'. This gentle yet powerful reminder to us, the church, is that when healing is our primary focus, the

task of the great commission becomes not just straightforward and relevant but also joyful. Conversely, if we focus solely on preaching without a desire and action to bring healing, the church's kerygma will go unheard.

In the gospels, we see that Jesus often healed before he preached during his ministry on earth. This approach makes disciple-making more relational, a perspective that John and Charles Wesley shared. They saw Christianity not as a religion but as a relationship. This understanding enlightens our approach to the great commission.

Imagine how our disciple-making efforts will be blessed if we, as a church, are intentional about allowing ourselves to be the instruments of healing to others through our words and actions before even inviting them to take the next step. Amen!
