Message from the Pastor

Dear Bethel Family,

I am saddened to begin with the news of the recent catastrophes caused by Hurricane Helene in six states. I extend my heartfelt thoughts and prayers to our fellow American brothers and sisters who have been affected. The recovery and rebuilding process will take years, and for some, the loss of a loved one will leave a permanent impact. Events like this serve as a reminder that there are things beyond our control, such as the path of a storm. I urge you to join me in prayer for those impacted by this disaster. Moreover, I encourage each of you to reach out to someone you know who has been affected by the hurricane. Even a simple phone call or a thoughtful note can make a significant difference to those going through difficult times.

As a church family, our support can also be extended through financial contributions. Whether big or small, I ask you to consider donating to the relief efforts by writing a check to Bethel with UMCOR/Hurricane Helene in the memo line. 100% of your donations for this cause will go towards supporting relief efforts. Additionally, I am excited to share the various new discipleship opportunities available at Bethel to help you grow in your knowledge and love of God. You can find more information about these opportunities on the church's website and choose the one that best suits your needs.

Starting Sunday, October 13th, I will be preaching a three-week sermon series titled "Gratitude Check." This series aims to encourage self-reflection on how grateful we are and how we can express our gratitude towards God and others. During each Sunday's worship, you will hear a member of Bethel family share their personal story about gratitude and its impact on their lives.

One way we, as Christians, can express our gratitude is through giving our time and money. I do not agree with the view that "the church doesn't need your money." Our Bethel family is always so generous with their support of our projects. It helps us "Live Our Faith and Share God's Love".



### Advent and Christmas Devotional Booklet

Bethel Church will continue our tradition of writing our own Advent and Christmas Devotional Booklet this year. Daily devotions, in the style of The Upper Room or My Daily Bread, written by our church family and friends, make the preparation for the season personal and meaningful. Our theme this year is "A Different Path". The Magi, or Wise Men as they are more commonly called, are a familiar part of the Christmas story. According to tradition, these astronomers had been waiting for years, watching the heavens, for a sign of the coming Messiah. When they saw the special star, they immediately set out to find the promised Savior. The Wise Men undertook a journey to encounter God. Isn't that what every Christian life is, in its essence, a journey to the definitive encounter with God? As we wait through the weeks of Advent for Christmas to come, what lessons can we learn from these seekers of the promised one? After finding and worshipping the baby, God instructed them to go home by a different path. What different path might God be calling you to follow in 2025?

A devotion is a sharing from the heart with a connection to a scripture passage. It is written for the pur-



pose of inspiring us to have hope and joy each day through the experience of Christ who has come in our lives. It begins with a scripture passage of one or two verses. Next there is a short story that relates to the passage and ends with the point you are wishing to make. A short prayer related to the story comes at the end. Be yourself in writing a devotional. Keep it short and to the point. You don't need to use theological or intellectual language, unless that is your style. Think about others reading this and how they might benefit. Our booklet will be published electronically and as a traditional paper booklet.

What are your stories of waiting and/or preparation that are part of your Advent/Christmas experience? What are your experiences of discovering hope, peace, joy or love amid traveling the unique path on your personal journey? Please write one of these as a short devotion to share with your Bethel Church family. Or if you are uncomfortable writing the devotion, share it orally, and we'll write it for you! You can even submit a drawing or photograph that portrays an Advent/Christmas experience.

As you consider your story, reflect on the following questions, the suggested scriptures, and/or your favorite Bible verses.

- God had placed in the Magi's hearts a yearning to meet the Savior. What yearnings has God placed in your heart recently?
- How are you following the star God has put before us? In what form does God's star appear in your life?
- How are you lighting a light that others might see and find their way to the Messiah?
- What stories will you tell? What examples will you live out?
- How will you make your heart, your family and your space ready to receive the one who comes?
- What gifts are you preparing to give the Christ Child in the coming year?
