Message from the Pastor

Dear Bethel Family,

Observing All Saints' Day every year is one of the Christian traditions that dates back to the early days of the church. On this day, Christians honor the saints, both living and deceased. Among these saints is one known as "The Reluctant Saint" or "The World's Most Beloved Saint," and that is none other than St. Francis of Assisi.

Born into a wealthy cloth merchant's family in Assisi, Francis enjoyed all the luxuries a young boy could dream of during his youth. He lived a colorful life, filled with wild parties and excess. Thomas of Celano, his biographer who knew him well, stated, "In other respects, an exquisite youth, he attracted a whole retinue of young people addicted to evil and accustomed to vice." Francis himself admitted, "I lived in sin" during this time. However, his transformation was remarkable. He became a model of extreme surrender, exemplified by his bold act of re-


turning the money he had stolen from his father to repair a church. When his father brought him before the bishop to hold him accountable publicly, St. Francis stripped off the clothes his father had given him and declared, "Pietro Bernardone is no longer my father. From now on, I can say with complete freedom, 'Our Father who art in heaven.'"

St. Francis emptied himself and was willing to embrace others, to the extent of not hesitating to touch and even kiss those suffering from leprosy. Engelbert, in his biography of St. Francis, illustrates this moment when he writes that "after completing his devotions, he went out to encounter the beggars in front of St. Peter's, a place teeming with them at all times. It was there that he proposed to one of them that they exchange clothes—an offer that, as one can well imagine, was eagerly accepted. Wearing the rags of the beggar and joining the group, he begged alongside them, shared their meager meal, and found so much happiness in experiencing this way of life that he wished to continue living it." This year, as you remember a saint who has made a difference in your life, will you surrender to Jesus and follow the example of the saint you honor?

Moreover, I invite you to join me for a new sermon series "I Quit" starting from Sunday Nov 10th. This sermon series will challenge us to examine some of the habits that hold us back from becoming better Christians and disciples. If you aspire to become a better follower of Jesus Christ, a better spouse, co-worker, friend, neighbor, or sibling, it all begins with the powerful decision to say, "I quit." Join for worship on Sunday as I will preach on growing in Christ's likeness by quitting habits of Assuming, Complaining and Comparing.

BETTY'S BLUEBERRY DESSERT From Betty Kiester, Geneice Kemper's Mom

2 boxes (two 3 oz. packages) raspberry Jello (or 1 - 6 oz. package)
2 cups boiling water
1 can blueberry pie filling
8 oz. crushed pineapple (<u>UN</u>-drained)

Mix Jello and water together until dissolved.
Add pie filling and pineapple
Mix together and pour in pan
After Jello has set, cover with topping
and chopped walnuts

TOPPING

8 oz. cream cheese – room temperature ½ cup sour cream ¼ cup sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla Chopped nuts (optional)

Combine all ingredients and mix until smooth. Spread over Jello and top with chopped nuts.

If you really like nuts, you can add them to the Jello mixture also.
